




















Donors Make Good Libraries into GREAT Libraries!

We sincerely thank each and every one of you for your financial support of the Library Foundation. This private support of the Louisville Free Public Library is essential to its many quality programs, resources and facilities.

Louisville is one of the very few library districts in the Commonwealth without its own dedicated funding stream via a library tax. As a result, the Louisville Free Public Library is a line item in the annual Louisville Metro budget - competing for funding with all other city departments. We are all aware of the financial stressors impacting our city, such as the pension crisis and increasing health insurance costs for public employees. During the resource allocation process, each Metro department makes its case to the administration for support. Certainly, the Police, Fire, Public Works, Health & Wellness, and others are all

essential to a safe and healthy community. But when making budget decisions, some may view the public library as an important amenity - rather than an essential component of the city's infrastructure.

But we think differently. We know that a free public library is a safe, productive environment for children after school and during summer months. It is a valuable resource for individuals looking for jobs and acquiring the necessary knowledge to get them. It is the medium that helps young families develop literacy skills together. It is the place that everyone can access to follow their dreams or find solutions to their challenges.

As a society, there is concern about losing community, diversity, critical thinking, educational curiosity, self-reliance, resilience, independence and interdependence. In Metro Louisville, we address these concerns through 18 libraries staffed by professionals serving more than 10,000 community members every day. The library infrastructure, materials, and people are here for members of the Louisville community. While Metro government provides the basic "bedrock" library funding, the donors to the Library Foundation support the extra "margin of excellence" that makes good libraries into great libraries.

With the 2019 completion of the Northeast Regional Library, 90 percent of Metro Louisville's population will live within 5 miles of a major resource library – libraries with high-quality, free meeting spaces; thousands of books; internet access; job training; early childhood learning; and programming for all ages. The completion of the Northeast Regional Library represents the culmination of a successful public-private partnership which began a decade ago, and which was not possible without your generous private donations.

Thank you for believing that our library system is not a luxury, but rather an essential component of community infrastructure which is more vital than ever. Our best to you,

Capital Expansion & Construction Update: The Northeast Regional Library
The Northeast Regional Library grows a little bigger every day at 15 Bellevoir Circle!
When completed, this cutting-edge library will be a hub for educational and community engagement and a cultural centerpiece in a thriving part of the city. It will provide convenient access to a vibrant community that is eager for improved library services, collaborative events, and robust programming. Northeast is the final of three regional libraries included in the Louisville Free Public Library's Master Facilities Plan.

In FY2018, the Library Foundation raised 90% of its \$3.8 million goal to complement \$14 million provided by Louisville Metro Government and the State of Kentucky for the project. We are continuing our fundraising efforts in FY2019.

Our Future

I'm excited to share with you that your Library is a busy and thriving neighborhood anchor. During this past year, LFPL grew yet again when we opened the new South Central Regional Library last July. Since opening, an average of 18,160 people visit South Central each month and check out 272,000 materials (an increase of 159%). South Central is also the home of the COLLIDER Artist-in-Residence program. This program, generously funded by Councilwoman Madonna Flood, connects the public with art and the people who create it. Since the COLLIDER opened, we have hosted 14 artists working more than 1,000 studio hours at the Library, and presenting more than 50 public workshops. The program has made innovative and interactive arts education accessible to hundreds of adults, teens, children, and families in the community.

Northeast Regional Library Capital Campaign

Needless to say, we are thrilled with the impact South Central Regional Library is making on the community. With its opening last year, the opening of the Southwest Regional Library in 2014, and the soon-to-be opened Northeast Regional Library, we will realize our goal of having a major resource library within five miles of 90% of Louisville residents.

Speaking of Northeast, construction continues on the new 40,000 square foot library in Lyndon. This state-of-the-art facility will enhance service for 170,000 residents in the area when it opens in spring of 2019. The St. Matthews Library expansion and renovation is also moving along. That project is being led by the City of St. Matthews, with additional support from Mayor Greg Fischer and Metro Council. We are excited and grateful to see the expansion of services in two of our busiest areas of the community.

And of course our outstanding Library staff continues to provide a vast array of educational programming at each library location. From baby storytimes to the annual Summer Reading Program, adult book discussion groups to computer classes, Library staff is helping make Louisville a city of lifelong learners.

At the Library, opportunities for education never end. We attracted thousands of patrons to special events, like this summer's Potterpalooza, GonzoFest, author visits, and the annual How-To Festival. We welcomed newcomers to their new city with cultural exchange programs and guidance. We rewarded nearly 26,000 young readers for finishing the Summer Reading Program. Through these innovative, dynamic programs, the Library continues to make a positive impact in the community.

As I finish my third year as Library Director at LFPL, I'm excited by the significant goals our dedicated staff have accomplished, and looking forward to another fantastic year to come.
